

Boykin's nonfiction book, <u>One Brief Miracle</u>: The Diplomat, the Zealot, and the Wild Blundering Siege, is the behind-closed-doors account of the American diplomat Philip Habib's mission to stop the 1982 Israeli siege of Beirut. Former Secretary of State George Shultz wrote the foreword. It won the American Academy of Diplomacy <u>book award</u> under its original hardcover title, *Cursed is the Peacemaker*. He wrote his first novel, <u>The Constitution Has Expired</u>, to explore what would happen if the United Stated Constitution had to be rewritten today.
